Taxpayer funds appropriated to private schools from 1997-2025 not including vouchers: \$5,558,392,326.

Included in this piece is a <u>table</u> of State appropriations for auxiliary services and non-public administrative cost reimbursement funds. The table does not include numerous other special appropriations to private schools that have been made through the years. Neither are transportation costs included.

The total auxiliary services provided to private schools for fiscal years 1997-2025 is \$3,839,255,038 and the total non-public administrative cost reimbursement for the same time period is \$1,719,137,288 for a total of \$5,558,392,326 for those two appropriated items.

There is no cost-based rationale for the biennial appropriations of these line items in the State budget. Initially, a number for each appropriation was pulled out of thin air. Thereafter the amount was typically increased by roughly the percentage of increase in the total K-12 education budget. An exception to this pattern was in the 1990's when the legislature approved a proposal by Governor Voinovich to double the non-public administrative cost reimbursement amount.

The voucher cost to taxpayers during the similar timeframe is \$3,871,514,397; hence, the grand total amount allotted to private schools since 1997 is \$9,429,906,723.
