

Tax-supported private schools have the potential to sow social discord—the public common schools sow social harmony.

Tax-supported private schools fracture the social order by the very nature of being private, in contrast to the unifying hallmark of the public common school.

Tax-supported private schools separate citizens, young and old, into enclaves of distinct social, ethnic, racial, economic, and religious groups. The privatization education delivery model is totally antithetical to the constitutionally-required common school model.

The privatization model for the delivery of education will allow a multitude of youth to fall through the cracks in that they don't fit any of the molds of the private sector, and thus they will be indiscriminately excluded from enrollment.

The public common school system welcomes all. Properly funded, the public system is capable of accommodating a multitude of educational choices while effectuating the common good, which is essential to democracy.
