

**School Choice Ohio (the anti-public school advocacy folks) recently published a pie chart showing the percentages of the K-12 school funds going to various sectors (K-12 districts, JVSD's, charters, vouchers, etc.)**

The accompanying note regarding the [pie chart](#) states that the biggest share goes for public education (74.7%) and that only 3.8% goes for EdChoice expansion. EdChoice and EdChoice expansion, according to their chart, total 6.4%. Note that joint vocational (career/tech) schools receive 4.5%.

Public education, according to School Choice Ohio, received three-fourths of the amount for education. By the way, the public common school system is required by the Constitution.

It is astonishing that Ohio has established a voucher refund/rebate program that requires 50% more funds than the state provides to JVSD's for workforce education.

The state's Fair School Funding Plan is underfunded by the same amount as the state's additional gift to the EdChoice voucher scheme.
