

Public school advocates and others who oppose tax money being allocated to religious private schools should raise their voices (and pens) in opposition to the EdChoice voucher program in Ohio.

The EdChoice voucher lawsuit filed by the Ohio Coalition for Equity and Adequacy of School Funding is moving forward remarkably well. But efforts to win in the court of public opinion must be ramped up.

A modicum of Ohioans is informed and somewhat engaged in an effort to provide information about how tax funded EdChoice vouchers hurt Ohio—school children, public schools, communities, etc.

Those who are informed and are concerned about the negative effects of the universal EdChoice voucher scheme and the ongoing campaign to increase the demand for vouchers may wish to ramp up their voices (and pens) against the current scheme and the ongoing schemes to expand the demand for vouchers, including tax funding for private school facilities. Some tactics to use

- Letters to the Editor
- Public participation in school board meetings
- Participation in radio talk shows
- Organizing and conducting community meetings
- Social media efforts to inform others
- Radio and TV appearances
- Kaffeeklatschs to discuss the EdChoice voucher scheme
- Petition drive to use for meetings with public officials
