

Billionaires who fund tax-supported school voucher advocacy organizations should repurpose their elephantine wealth to fund vouchers for those who want to attend private school.

[Multi-billionaire Jeffrey Yass will be donating \\$900,000](#) to cover the cost of the vouchers the South Carolina Supreme Court declared unconstitutional. This is a fine, notable act on his part.
