

Franklinton High School charter school class action [complaint](#) against Columbus City Schools Board of Education for refusal to transport certain students in Statement of Facts number 20: Plaintiffs net profit per student, for each year, is approximately \$10,000.

The full Statement of Facts number 20:

Plaintiff's net profit per student, for each year that student attends school, is approximately \$10,000. The damages caused by the multiple students leaving or deciding not to attend Plaintiff's school due to Defendant's denial of transportation or a transportation stipend, multiplied by the multiple years of school per student, adds up to millions in lost revenue for Plaintiff.

Franklinton claims that Columbus City School Board's failure to transport the students in question is costing the charter school \$10,000 net profit per student each year. This seems like a very lucrative business model. So much for the original talking points of charter school advocates that charters will produce better outcomes at less cost. Wow! "\$10,000 net profit per student per year."
