

Private school voucher advocates don't argue that the Ohio Constitution upholds the EdChoice voucher scheme—because they can't.

Voucher advocates keep changing their rationale for vouchers: rescue poor kids from high poverty school districts; give poor kids an opportunity to attend private schools; private school constituents pay taxes; parents have a right to school choice, i.e. privatization; school vouchers are the civil rights movement of this era; vouchers create equity; etc. However, they don't argue that the voucher scheme is constitutional, because they can't. The EdChoice voucher scheme is contrary to the state's responsibility for the public common school.
