

If the U.S. Supreme Court rules in favor of the Oklahoma Virtual Charter School established to advance the Catholic doctrine, will charter schools lose their status as public schools?

In January 2023, in defiance of the Oklahoma Attorney General's ruling, the Oklahoma Virtual Charter School board approved a Catholic charter school proposal that follows and promotes Catholicism.

The Oklahoma Supreme Court ruled against the charter school; however, proponents filed a Writ of Certiorari. The Court agreed to hear the case.

The outcome of this case will have serious implications for public education, church-state separation, and religious freedom.
