

Boards of Education have a responsibility to protect their school-age resident students and property taxpayers.

Private school voucher students lose:

- Due process of law

Vouchers reduce the state revenue flowing to school districts, which puts a greater financial burden on the property tax base. Does the board of education have the responsibility to protect the taxpayers of the district?
