Cleveland Browns owners Jimmy and Dee Haslam gave a total of more than \$100,000 to top legislative leaders in recent months, as the team is seeking lawmakers' approval of \$600 million in state-backed bonds to help build a new stadium in suburban Brook Park.

When questioned about the donations, Ohio House Speaker Matt Huffman, a Lima Republican who accepted \$61,000 in campaign contributions from the Haslams last year, said:
