Parental rights: The Ohio Constitution requires the General Assembly to secure a thorough and efficient system of common schools throughout the state and forbids any sect, religious or secular, to control any part of the school funds (Article VI, section 2). Parents have the right to opt out of the public common school system, but the state is not permitted to pay for a parent's choice of a private education.

School choice: Yes, parents have a right to school choice but have no right to require their neighbors to pay for that private choice.
