

Private school greed has caused tension between the private and public school sectors.

The tension can be illustrated by a response by former legislator, attorney Stephen Dyer, to a [memo by Frank O'Linn Ed.D.](#), Superintendent of Schools, Catholic Dioceses of Cleveland.

The fact is that the state's shift of public school funds to the private sector is contributing to the property tax crisis in Ohio and the financial strain on a major portion of Ohio school districts. The legislative leadership scrapped the Cupp/Patterson Fair School Funding Plan saying it was not sustainable, but at the same time fully funding the unconstitutional EdChoice voucher program. **VOUCHERS HURT OHIO.**

Before the private school voucher greed set in, the public school sector had only a modicum of concern about Ohio being number one in the nation in financial support for private schools via private school transportation, auxiliary services, and nonpublic administrative cost reimbursement, and even some vouchers for "poor kids".
